Three In A Row

One evening while sharing a bottle of Black Velvet, two men sat discussing building a bowling center. The next day, Terry Thompson and Jay Carson went and applied for a loan. In 1961, Valie Lanes was born. The new owners were Terry and Carol Thompson and Jay and Helen Carson. (Carol and Helen are sisters).

Local residents breathed a sigh of relief because they didn't have to take any more long trips to the surrounding centers to bowl.

The new AMF automatic pin setters, underground ball returns and the circular ball racks constituted only a few of the latest improvements in the sport of bowling that the area bowlers enjoyed at Valie Lanes. At that time, open bowling was 50 cents a line for adults and 35 cents for the youth.

In 1969 Terry and Carol bought out Jay and Helen and are still the owners today. They have three children, Tanis, Tod and Christa, who all work at the lanes. Tanis operates the lanes and

Tod fills in when Tanis can't be there. At this time there are three generations bowling at the center.

New AMF machines were installed in 1974. In 1997 they did a remodeling project, adding new carpet, automatic scoring and other improvements. A drive up window for take out at the pizza shop was also added in 2001.

Tanis and Tod ask their dad about painting and doing different things at the center. No matter what he says they do it anyway.

Something interesting took place behind the counter at Valie. Can anyone guess what?

Earl (Peanut) Hilbert was the first man to roll a 300 game in the mid 60's. Tod Thompson has highest series of 868. Tanis Thompson-Horn is the only woman at Valie to bowl a 300 game. Tanis holds the women's high 700 series with a 776.

AJBC Youth program started in the mid 70's. Some of the adults from the youth program are: Chris Sayre, Tod Thompson, Tanis Thompson-Horn, Christa Thompson and Ellis Fulton.

Valie has open bowling Friday and Saturdays. The third Friday of every month there is a no tap tournament.

Harold (Popeye) Carlon bowled three nights a week at Valie until he was 97 years young. Every night he came in to bowl, he would complain to Terry about the condition of the lanes. He must have liked it because he kept coming back. And can anyone remember Angle Carson walking on his hands?

Needless to say, the Thompson family are avid bowlers and promoters of the game. Terry

and Carol have kept this business in the family and have a legacy of bowling memories. Their grandson, Drew Horn, Tanis and Randy's son, recently made them all proud! Drew, pictured below, is 14 years old now and he just rolled his first 700 series with games of 236, 246 and a 222 making a 704 series! Great Bowling Drew!

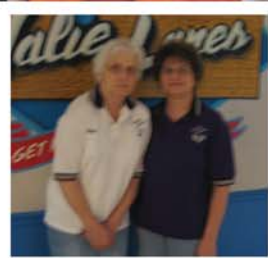

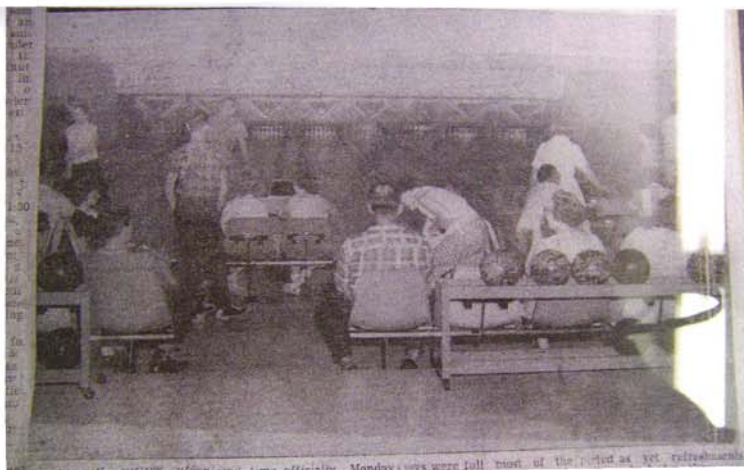

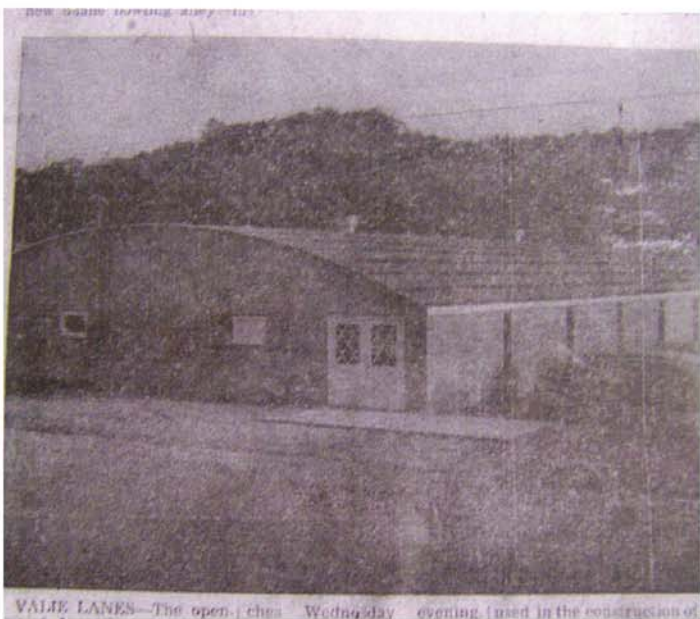
